Permit Update: Needmore Aquifer Test

Large volume permits (over 2 million gallons per year) require an aquifer test to inform the Board's decision on the final permit volume. In general, aquifer tests are designed to induce a measurable response in monitor wells. The volume pumped, rate of pumping, and measured response at monitor wells at various distances from the pumping well are used to evaluate aquifer parameters and model long-term aquifer response.

In late January, the District coordinated with Needmore Ranch owners and consultants to perform the required aquifer test in support of their application to convert the temporary permit to a regular permit pursuant to the HB 3405 permit process. Monitor wells were equipped with pressure transducers that continuously logged changes in water levels before, during, and after the pumping. After the post-pumping recovery period, data will be downloaded, compiled, analyzed and submitted to the District to satisfy the permit application requirements. Staff will evaluate the data and conclusions and present findings to the Board at a Board Meeting.

Water level: 527 ft above msl In response to the recent rains, the water level has risen about 10 ft since last month. This well is completed in the matrix of the aquifer and typically shows slow and steady water level changes.

Each year one essay is selected as the winning entry by an independent evaluation panel, and the author receives a \$2,500 scholarship to the college, community college, or training institution of his/her choice.

Essays must generally discuss groundwater issues, which may include but are not limited to non-point source pollution, pollution prevention, water conservation, or hydrogeology. While essays must focus on groundwater issues, applicants do not have to be planning a career path in a water-related field.

The essay contest is open to high school juniors, seniors, and immediate graduates. Students must reside in one of the eight school districts overlapping the District boundary. These eight independent school districts are: Austin, Del Valle, Dripping Springs, Eanes, Hays Consolidated, Lockhart, San Marcos Consolidated, and Wimberley.
