General Manager, Carl Haack reported that Comal County is currently experiencing Severe Drought to Moderate Drought conditions. Over the past 30 days between 4.0" to 15.0" of precipitation was observed which was between 2.0" to 8.0" above normal across the County. The CTGCD monitoring wells #1,2,3,9,10,11,12,13,14,15,16,17,19,21,22,24 and 25 showed a decrease in water levels ranging from -0.07' to -34.64'. Monitoring wells #5,6,8, #6807407 and #6815211 showed an increase in water levels ranging from +0.00' to +12.41' during the first quarter of 2026.
 - b. Report on prior quarter non-exempt groundwater data. Report on the First Quarter 2026 non-exempt groundwater data; GMA-9 users reported 976 acre-feet for the quarter, which is 10% of GMA-9's MAG. GMA-10 users reported 2,186 acre-feet for the quarter, which is 7% of GMA-10's MAG.
 - c. Report on prior quarter well authorizations. A total of 26 well and plugging applications were received during the First Quarter of 2026.
 - d. Report on CTGCD activity in support of water conservation and rainwater harvesting education. DiPasquale spoke about how Rain Bees has been educating the community about rainwater harvesting and conservation.
 - e. Report on other items of importance. There was no report on recent items of importance.
 - f. Report on most recent GMA-9 meetings (March 31, 2026, Attended by Haack). Haack reported that the recent GMA-9 meeting was DFC focused.

1. Daniel Meyer called the hearing to order at 9:10 AM.
2. Open public hearing for Groundwater Management Area (GMA) 10 Proposed Desired Future Conditions (DFCs) and Relevant Aquifer Designations. Mr. Meyer stated there was a public comment form that had the list of the proposed Desired Future Conditions that the GMA-10 members approved on April 27th, 2026. Mr. Meyer stated there were a number of different aquifers for the DFC: Trinity, Trinity Comal, Trinity Medina, Trinity Plum Creek, Trinity Uvalde, Trinity Bexar County, Trinity non-district DFC for Guadalupe, Travis, and the Austin Chalk Uvalde, and Buda Limestone Uvalde, Edwards for Barton Springs based on spring flow - have 2 different DFCs; Edwards for Kinney County, Leona Gravel for Uvalde County, and Saline Edwards. Mr. Meyer announced those in attendance: Daniel Meyer, Executive Manager of Plum Creek; Tyler Farco with Plum Creek Conservation District, and Alan Burklund, Project Manager for Plum Creek Conservation District. Mr. Meyer stated there were two public individuals in attendance.
3. Daniel Meyer requested both oral and written comments, testimony, and other documentation and information relevant to the Proposed GMA 10 Desired Future Conditions and Relevant Aquifer Designations. Ms. Claudia Hollern introduced herself and stated that she was going to read something on behalf of a concerned citizen who could not be at the hearing today. Ms. Hollern then read the following: "Good evening Directors, staff, and fellow community members. My name is Danielle Kelly. Like you, I live, work, and grow my family here in Caldwell County. Today I am here in support of your proposed Desired Future Conditions limiting average drawdown for Trinity aquifer to not exceed 16 feet by the year 2080. First, thank you for your service and for the work you do protecting our groundwater resources. I understand this hearing is about Desired Future Conditions for an aquifer, not about approving or denying any specific development project. I also recognize that many decisions regarding industrial growth occur at the city, county, and state level, but that is exactly why this hearing matters and why I am here today in support of cautious and conservative-minded approaches to the proposed DFC for the Trinity aquifer. We look to you as we grow, more

concerned, to consider how much groundwater depletion we are willing to accept over the next several decades. Caldwell County is growing rapidly, new neighborhoods being built, families are moving here, farmers, ranchers, businesses, and rural landowners all depend on the same groundwater resources. At the same time, we are seeing proposals for large industrial developments that will put significant strain on our water supply, while not benefiting any of us as residents. None of us can predict exactly what Caldwell County will look like in 2080, but we do know that our kids and future residents will need water just as much as we do today. Because of that uncertainty, I respectfully ask the District to continue to take conservative approaches in groundwater management and consider expanding groundwater monitoring and public reporting where possible. We are not looking at any singular project, but potentially in an emerging industrial corridor and must be prepared for it. Specifically, I would like the District to discuss and evaluate whether current monitoring is sufficient enough to provide an adequate basis of ongoing information, whether additional monitoring wells or reporting requirements should be considered. I also ask for discussion by the Board regarding how the District will monitor and evaluate large-scale industrial groundwater demands over time and how residents will be informed if groundwater conditions begin moving away from the Desired Future Condition goals. How will we know whether future industrial growth is affecting the Trinity aquifer, if we do not continuously improve groundwater monitoring, public record, and cumulative impact evaluations today? If groundwater sustainability is important enough to plan through the year 2080, then it is important enough to ensure we have the monitoring, transparency, and data necessary to protect these resources today. Water is one of the few resources we cannot replace. Careful monitoring and informed decision-making today will help ensure that future generations of Caldwell County residents have access to the same water resources we depend on now. Thank you so much for your time, your services, and your commitment to protecting our groundwater.

David Hughes introduced himself and stated that he was a Lockhart, Texas resident who was born here when Lockhart had a hospital, and lives on 2001/State Park Road, and said thank you for the opportunity to speak. Mr. Hughes stated the following: "My family owns a small farm within the city limits. We are currently growing cotton, beef cattle, and doing our best to carry out the legacy of my grandfather. It's never been easy, but it's always been rewarding, and I believe that we are doing our small part to keep Lockhart feeling like Lockhart. I am here today because I am concerned about groundwater depletion. Despite this much needed rain we've received, drought conditions have become the norm as you know. Our well went dry earlier this year and we were forced to switch to city water to fill water troughs for our cattle. Developers are chomping at

the bit to surround our farm with subdivisions and will need access to the same water infrastructure and, of course, industrial developers are adding to this strain on our water infrastructure. Therefore, groundwater sustainability is an important issue for us. We want to be here. We want to continue to operate our farm for decades so today I am here in support of your Desired Future Conditions, limiting average drawdown for the Trinity aquifer to not exceed 16 feet by the year 2080. I also request that the District continues to take a conservative approach in groundwater management and considers expanding groundwater monitoring and public reporting when possible. The work that you do makes a difference in our lives and the lives of our future generations. Please continue to make sure that we have monitoring, transparency and data necessary to protect those resources now and as we move ahead. Thank you."

4. Discussion on public comments received to date. Mr. Meyer then stated he had received oral comments and that he was not aware of any written comments, but there may be some more coming in and would be included in the comment period. Mr. Meyer stated he would leave the hearing open a little longer in case anyone came in late.
5. Close public hearing. Mr. Meyer stated the time was 9:36 and there were no additional written comments or oral comments, so he closed the GMA-10 public hearing.
