5. Public Hearing.

Carpenter Road Ranch LLC, (584 McKinnon Loop, Hays, TX 78610) filed two well drilling applications on October 10, 2022 with the Barton Springs/Edwards Aquifer Conservation District (District) for two new nonexempt wells. One well is proposed to be discretely completed in the Lower Trinity aquifer and the second in the Middle Trinity aquifer. They are planned to be used as a public water supply well to support the RV park development staff and visitors. Both wells will also be used for landscape irrigations throughout the park and to supply water to both a recreational lake and swimming pool. Two separate Production Permit Applications will be required in order to operate and produce from these wells in the future. The proposed wells are located in Hays County at 584 McKinnon Loop (30.125619°, -97.883164° and 30.125568°, -97.882605° respectfully.) **Pg. 45**

Summary of May 2023 Team Activities and On Deck for June/July 2023

Aquifer Science Team

May Activities:

- Analyzing Edwards and Trinity water-level data for responses to ongoing drought and April rainfall.
- Reviewing data from recently installed telemetry equipment at Amos and JWNA wells.
- Comments from the TAC on the final draft of In-house Model (IHM) report are being reviewed.

On Deck:

- Barton Springs discharge measurements to track USGS gauge accuracy in drought conditions.
- Sampling for summer TWDB program will begin on May 9.
- Magellan pipeline annual sampling

Administration Team

May Activities:

- June monthly billings and 4th quarter billings to go out on May 16, 2023.
- Drought Management Fees now being assessed for 7th month. Details in Status Report.

Regulatory Compliance Team

DROUGHT MANAGEMENT

Drought Status and Water-Level Monitoring (Justin)

We currently remain in Critical Drought status (Stage III). It was officially declared on October 20, 2022. One of the District's drought triggers, Lovelady Monitor Well, passed below its Critical Drought (Stage III) trigger on October 17, 2022.

April rainfall delivered an average of 4 inches across the District, almost 2 inches above its historical average of 2.1 inches. As of May 4, no rain has fallen within the District so far this month.

On May 4, the Lovelady well had a level of 460.0 ft msl, 2.7 ft below the trigger level for Critical drought (Stage III) and about 2.9 ft above Stage IV Exceptional drought. Lovelady crossed under the Stage II trigger on May 26 and under Stage III on October 17.

Also on May 4, Barton Springs was flowing at 28 cfs (10-day average). 10 cfs below the Stage II Alarm drought trigger point of 38 cfs. The Stage III Critical trigger is 20 cfs. Barton Springs crossed under the Stage II drought trigger in late June 2022. April showers helped keep spring flow above Stage III and the May rain forecast looks to do the same for the foreseeable future.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) climate forecasters declared on March 9, 2023 that La Niña conditions have left the building and the Pacific Ocean-atmospheric system has transitioned to neutral conditions. They're also forecasting (as of May 1) a 62% chance of El Nino developing during May — July which could mean returning to average rainfall conditions in the typically-wettest time of the year (March-June). The month of April didn't disappoint as an average of 4 inches (2 inches above historical average) fell bringing the first above average rainfall since August 2022! Could this be the beginning of a wetter-than-normal trend? All signs are pointing towards yes. The timing would be perfect as we enter the two wettest months of the year (May & June).





DISTRICT PROJECTS

GMA Joint Planning

► GMA 10 Coordination (Tim)

The GMA 10 joint-planning group received a Statement of Interest from both LRE Water and Collier Consulting in response to an RFQ issued on March 3rd for consulting services related to the current joint-planning process. Representatives from both firms will appear before the GMA 10 Planning Group at the May 10th meeting to be held in San Antonio, Texas.

Trinity Aquifer Sustainable Yield Study & Planning

> Policy Concepts and Advisory Workgroup Planning (Kendall)

The GM and staff are continuing to research and compile policy concepts related to sustainable yield and unreasonable impacts. Staff had a kick on meeting with Intera on the Trinity well Impact Analysis in mid-March and another meeting with them on the Trinity Sustainability Project in early April. Staff has a second meeting with Intera on May 11th to get an update on both projects.

Technical Evaluations (Brian, Jeff)

Aquifer Science staff continue to collect data on the geology and hydrogeology related to the Trinity Aquifers. We are evaluating water-level data for a number of Trinity wells to look for long-term trends and aquifer responses to the ongoing and worsening drought. The results of this analysis should provide insight on both the severity and spatial distribution of drought impacts at various locations within the district, and should also inform us as to whether the District's current drought triggers provide an adequate gage of Trinity Aquifer health at worsening stages of drought. Aquifer Science staff are reviewing water-quality data from Trinity wells and springs. An update to previous assessments is needed because of new wells and new data from previously sampled wells. These data will help us understand any changes to water quality as a result of drought and pumping.

The Trinity in-house model (IHM), currently under development, will allow for simulation of different pumping and drought scenarios over time, and water-level data collected during the present drought will eventually assist us in calibrating/validating the model for drought conditions in future iterations of the model. A Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) consisting of 12 professionals with knowledge of the hydrogeology of central Texas and of numerical groundwater models, has reviewed the final draft of the IHM model draft report and a number of the TAC members have submitted comments on the report. Aquifer Science staff are reviewing the comments and preparing the final report. The IHM will provide a valuable tool for guiding policymaking discussions for the Trinity Sustainable Yield project.

We are members of a technical committee to guide the development of a numerical groundwater model (BRAAT) of the aquifers influenced by the Blanco River. Southwest Research Institute started work on the BRAAT model in September of 2021 but contracting issues stalled development of the model. Modelling efforts restarted in July 2022 after the contracting issues were resolved. A meeting of the technical committee was held on December 7, in which the head modeler provided an update on BRAAT modeling efforts. The BRAAT team has estimated that the model should be completed by late summer or fall of 2023.

Habitat Conservation Plan (Brian)

Planning for Technical Tasks: Aquifer Science staff are coordinating studies at Barton Springs with COA staff. These studies include measurement of dissolved oxygen (DO) in the Barton Springs pool and the installation of a monitor well within Zilker Park and south of the pool. Deployment of this equipment will take place after the monitor well is installed. We submitted an application for a grant from the City of Austin in February which would help pay for the conversion of a standard monitor well to a multiport well. The purpose of the monitor well is to understand how groundwater flows from the deeper portions of the Edwards Aquifer to the springs and how DO is distributed vertically in the aquifer. The HCP identified low levels of DO as a threat to the endangered salamanders. A potential remedy for low DO during severe drought is augmentation of DO in the shallow aquifer so that the threat of low DO is reduced.

Database Management System - LRE Water (Tim/Kendall)

District staff has had several meetings with LRE since the kickoff. LRE has completed most of phase 1 (data migration and map) and is getting feedback from staff. Staff has had multiple meetings with LRE in March and early April. LRE is still working on data migration, map, and is beginning to work on the wells module. District staff is continuing to work on data clean up and QA/QC and expects to meet with LRE in mid-May. The District is hoping to share an alpha version of the map and wells page with soon.

ILA Commitments (Brian)

The District has an ILA with COA to coordinate studies for the respective HCPs such as scientific feasibility studies and monitoring evaluations; to collaborate on the planning of future Kent Butler Summits; and to exchange technical information regularly on an annual basis. An annual technical meeting is held between BSEACD and COA in December each year to discuss each organization's activities related to their respective HCPs. The meeting for 2022 was held on December 12.

Region K Planning Activities (Tim)

The Region K Planning Group met in Austin on April 26, 2023. The primary topic of discussion was the proposed demand forecasts for each of the nonmunicipal water-use sectors (i.e., livestock; steam electric; mining; manufacturing; and irrigation) and how revised consultant forecasts, by decade, compared to the original draft 2026 projections along with the projections that were featured in the 2021 Regional Water Plan. The status of ongoing municipal population and demand estimates and potential revisions was also discussed. The next meeting is set for July 12, 2023.

LITIGATION AND LEGISLATION

Litigation and SOAH Activities (Kendall)

There is no activity to report.

RULEMAKING, PERMITTING, AND ENFORCEMENT

Rulemaking (Erin, Kendall)

If there is direction from the Board, staff will initiate a narrow rulemaking effort on administrative or procedural changes regarding rules related to the potential for unreasonable impacts (PUI). Staff has had discussions internally and with legal counsel regarding the Enforcement Plan, including drought enforcement. Other areas that are being discussed are notice language and change of ownership timelines. However, the enforcement plan analysis and any rule changes are on a temporary hold so staff can prioritize work on sustainable yield concepts and other preparations that have been suggested by our attorney. Staff did meet in February to discuss guiding principles for enforcement changes.

In November, staff gave a presentation to the Board on District rules pertaining to the PUI. Staff provided a debrief on the challenges and lessons learned from applying the rules to large permit applications prior to annexation and discussed administrative considerations such as inadequate fees, staff time, timelines, and public comment process for PUI applications. Staff recommended initiating narrow rulemaking on administrative and procedural changes and will be working on the rule concepts in this fiscal year. Staff has started to review and draft rule changes related to the notice for PUI.

Drought (Erin)

- Continuing to work through the enforcement process to address the non-compliance of drought curtailment volumes for Texas Old Town.
- Held 5 pre-enforcement meetings with permittees deemed non-compliant in March.
- Will continue monthly pumpage analysis to determine all permittee's compliance status of drought curtailments.
- Will continue to assist permittees in ensuring they successfully comply with their UDCPs and Stage III drought curtailments for April.

AQUIFER STUDIES (Aquifer Science Team)

Permitting Hydrogeologic Studies:

Working with Regulatory Compliance on permitting issues as needed. AS staff are reviewing geophysical logs of wells prior to final completion of the wells. In April, AS staff reviewed a drilling proposal submitted by Creedmoor-Maha for a Trinity well to be installed in their Edwards well field.

Groundwater Studies: Dye Tracing, Water Quality, Aquifer Characterizations

- Coleman's Canyon-. We are continuing to collect water-level data from the multiport well every month
 to 6 weeks. Groundwater sampling of these two wells will begin in May as part of the TWDB summer
 sampling program.
- There are no dye-trace studies planned at this time because of minimum to no flow in streams and springs.

Field Activities:

- Cooperating with USGS and City of Austin staff to confirm accurate real-time gauge reporting at Barton Springs and Lovelady. Conducting bi-weekly to monthly field measurements.
- Updating telemetry monitoring equipment at the Needmore index well (Amos). Reviewing pumping
 and water-level data as moderate amounts of rain over the past few months have slowed entry into the
 next stage of drought. We are reviewing water-level and flow data following the moderate to heavy
 rain of early April.
- Antioch- Continuing to maintain the system and to collect data on flow into the vault (when there is flow). A recent visit to Antioch Cave indicated that gravel-sized rocks are entering one of the valves and potentially limiting the amount of recharge into the cave.
- Well monitoring- Because of drought, we are increasing the amount of time maintaining equipment in numerous monitor wells and downloading and interpreting data. We are occasionally checking on wells that have been reported as "dry".

Trinity Aquifer Modeling Development:

- BRAAT modeling: Southwest Research Institute started work on this model in September 2021, but
 activity was on hold as funding issues were resolved. SWRI restarted the project in late July and are
 continuing to make progress. A meeting with the BRAAT review team was held on December 7. It is
 estimated that the BRAAT model will be completed by late summer or fall of 2023.
- In-house model: A preliminary draft report on the model was completed in May 2022 and a presentation
 was made to the Board. Subsequently, improvements to the model were made and another round of
 model calibration was completed. The Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) has reviewed the final
 draft of the IHM report. We are reviewing comments from the TAC as we prepare the final report.

COMMUNICATIONS AND OUTREACH (position currently vacant)

A vacancy announcement closed on April 17. The District's Hiring Committee has begun to interview the top four candidates during the week of May 1st.

The Institute for Government Innovation (IGI) at Texas State University has maintained a District presence on social media and has developed a content calendar for such. Becca Cade, a junior in the Communication Studies program, works 17 hours per week on the District project alone. The GM met with the IGI team on April 18th to discuss the details of a social media content calendar and a branding strategy that will promote a more consistent look among the various posts and messages that go out.

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

Accounts Receivable / Permittee Cycle Billings

On May 16, June monthly billings (for June useage), and 4th quarter billings (for June/July/August) will go out for a total of \$325,691.83 (June monthly \$20,359.54; June quarterly \$85,338.29; and CoA/AWU quarterly \$219,994).

Budget and Fee Schedule FY 2024

Budget preparation has begun. Committee usually meets sometime in May-July. Budget and Fee Schedule need to be finalized and approved by July 31 at the latest, according to CoA Settlement Agreement (30 days before the end of the District fiscal year).

Drought Management Fees (DMFs)

Tracking monthly DMFs began in October (for September pumpage).

Total DMFs invoiced for FY 2023 (beginning in October) is \$15,680.

Transparency Star-related: Most current, available financial reports are to be posted on our website and accessible within three clicks, as required by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts Transparency Star Program. Balance Sheets, Profit and Loss Statements, and Check Registers (Operating and Payroll) through April 2023 are posted on the District website.

Administration is setting up <u>personnel</u> and <u>benefits e-files</u> as part of a new HR file structure, as instructed. Expected to be completed within a few month's time. On-going project.



Public Hearing

Carpenter Road Ranch LLC, (584 McKinnon Loop, Hays, TX 78610) filed two well drilling applications on October 10, 2022 with the Barton Springs/Edwards Aquifer Conservation District (District) for two new nonexempt wells. One well is proposed to be discretely completed in the Lower Trinity aquifer and the second in the Middle Trinity aquifer. They are planned to be used as a public water supply well to support the RV park development staff and visitors. Both wells will also be used for landscape irrigations throughout the park and to supply water to both a recreational lake and swimming pool. Two separate Production Permit Applications will be required in order to operate and produce from these wells in the future. The proposed wells are located in Hays County at 584 McKinnon Loop (30.125619°, -97.883164° and 30.125568°, -97.882605° respectfully.)

Application Summary and Staff Recommendations 05/01/2023

DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION

Applicant: Carpenter Road Ranch, LLC

Type of Applications: Well Drilling Authorizations for one (1) new well in Middle Trinity

Management Zone and one (1) new well in Lower Trinity Management

Zone

Request: Applicants request to drill one (1) well in the Middle Trinity Aquifer and

one (1) well in the Lower Trinity Aquifer for the purpose of public water supply to support a new RV Park development along with staff and visitors which may also include commercial and irrigation uses. A separate Production Permit Application will be required in order to operate and

produce from this well in the future.

REASON FOR REQUEST

Carpenter Road Ranch, LLC filed two (2) well drilling authorization applications on October 10, 2022, with the District for one new nonexempt Middle Trinity well and one new nonexempt Lower Trinity well. The proposed use of the new wells will be to provide water for both park staff and visitors. The wells may also be used to support a small café/coffee shop planned for the development in addition to irrigation of landscaping and maintaining water levels in a swimming pool and recreational pond located onsite. If the applicant finds the groundwater production and quality to be adequate and desirable, the applicant will file a future production permit applications separately for each well in which case they would have to support these requests by completing a full-scale aquifer tests and hydrogeological reports.

WELL/RECEIVING AREA LOCATION

The proposed wells are located in Travis County on a 54.78-acre tract located south of the termination of Carpenter Road in Manchaca (30° 07′ 32.23″ N, 97° 52′ 59.39″ W, and 30° 07′ 32.04″ N, 97° 52′ 57.38″ W). Attachment A shows the location of the proposed new well (Well #7) and the location of the previously drilled wells (Well #1, Well #2, and Well #3). The produced groundwater is proposed to be used primarily for a future RV development and amenities associated with this development.

WELL DESIGN

One well is expected to be completed in the Middle Trinity. The total well depth of the Middle Trinity Well will be approximately 1,300' ft below ground surface and completed so that water is only produced from Middle Trinity Lower Glen Rose and Cow Creek Formations. The second well is expected to be completed in the Lower Trinity. The total well depth of the Lower Trinity Well will be approximately 1,650' ft below ground surface and completed so that water is only produced from the Hammett Formation (Attachment B)

APPLICATION REVIEW

- Staff has reviewed the applications and have determined that both of the applications have satisfied all the requirements pursuant to the application checklist requirements in District Rule 3-1.4.A and that the required documentation and payment of fees have been satisfied.
- Staff has determined that the applicant has sufficiently addressed the criteria and considerations for Board action in accordance with District Rule 3-1.6(A).
- Staff has confirmed that the applicant filed proper notice and the required 20-day public comment period has expired in accordance with District Rule 3-1.4.B. (Attachment C).





This letter is a public comment regarding the two well drilling applications you received for Carpenter Road Ranch LLC.

I am opposed to one, if not both, of these wells due to the fact that they want to drain too much water from the Trinity aquifers. A three acre lake supplied with public water is outrageous! We are in a stage III water restriction in the Trinity now. This is a huge waste of water. Water we don't have. This is ranch land and does not need irrigation. It should stay native and natural. There is no way an RV park would need two wells.

Secondly, I don't see how he can even build an RV park on that land because this property is landlocked. There is private land all the way around it. He currently has a 12' easement off of Carpenter Lane, which is not large enough for RVs, and there is no chance this will change. The only other option is for him to get an easement from Milestone Community Builders who owns the Gragg Tract. Even if he did get that, the RVs would have to come off of McKinnon Loop and that road is not set up for RVs.

Third, this entire property is over the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone. I don't think I need to explain why an RV park would not be good here.

I have one question for you. What happens if an RV park never gets built and the land is used for something else such as a wastewater disposal site for a subdivision?

Please deny one or both of these applications. This man is sleazy and is probably working a back door deal with Milestone. Neither one of them are to be trusted.

To Whom it may concern,

We live on a property in close proximity to a newly proposed development that includes an RV park and affiliated services that will be in close proximity to our (and our neighbors') drinking water well. We received a letter in the mail last week notifying us of the development and two wells that are intended to be drilled nearby.

Two wells are intended to be drilled into the middle and lower Trinity Aquifers (30.125619deg, -97.883164deg and 30.125568deg, -97.882605deg), and we would like to be made aware of further notifications and upcoming hearings for discussion about the impacts of the new wells. There are already extensive new developments in the area (even though we are positioned over delicate aquifer recharge zones), and water levels and quality in the Trinity Aquifer have been declining for several years.

Additionally, the choice of land use by this project has very direct implications on the water quality of our well as the proposed development sits on land that directly recharges the Edwards Aquifer. Our entire community, built in the 70's, was deed restricticted as to how densely we can develop or even stock livestock based on development impact on the aquifers and water quality. This project potentially contradicts that intent, and we would like to hear justifications for safe and long term intentions for responsible development.

We care a lot about water quality and proposed future land use. Since the developers of this project have never reached out to us as adjacent neighbors and land owners who share responsibility of the land use and ecological care of the systems we share, we look forward to the opportunity to open that discussion during these hearings rather than after the project has landed in our laps with no shared discussions or visions.

I'm also interested in learning who the initial parties are who originally contested the well(s) and additional parties who have expressed interest. To be transparent, I have watched prior City of Austin Environmental Commission Board hearings where this entity or related entities have presented former proposals for water and other services, and the City of Austin does not support additional services to this area due to the potential of overly dense or damaging development on this environmentally sensitive tract of land. I see now that the developer has changed land use type and has moved all activities to Hays County (presumably in order to avoid jurisdictional oversite from the City of Austin), so I look forward to hearing how this project expects to approach ecosystem care in a responsible manner despite the source of jurisdictional oversight.

We're all neighbors, and our boundaries of responsibility go beyond our own arbitrary politically defined property lines.
