

Adopted FY 2014 District Goals

(Adoption Date: September 26, 2013)

The following goals are proposed for adoption by the Board to guide the District's efforts for Fiscal Year 2014. The Board will assess achievement or substantial progress towards achievement of the goals as of the end the fiscal year or after August 31, 2014.

1. Operating the District in a financially prudent manner such that expenditures further the goals and objectives of the District and that use of operational and reserve funds in FY 2014 explicitly reflects the District's agenda and the will of the Board.
2. Conducting scientific studies and developing the regulatory framework to effectively manage the various management zones that will promote and protect alternative water supplies along with native groundwater resources.
3. Actively participating as an agency stakeholder in the EIS preparation process for SH 45 SW, to ensure the provisions and spirit of the consent decree are upheld and that recharge-related karst features are adequately protected.
4. Facilitating policy changes and providing education and outreach targeted towards homeowners that live over and rely upon the Edwards Aquifer, their homeowner associations, and the entities that are involved in property transfers, to emphasize the importance of water conservation, water quality protection, applicable GCD requirements, and the property-owner's responsibilities associated with well operation and ownership.
5. Effectively implementing already approved but pending rules and developing additional strategies, as warranted, that enable the preservation of the adopted DFCs for District's managed aquifers.
6. Encourage the establishment of effective and functional groundwater management in the area of the Hill Country PGMA in Travis County and the contributing zone of the Barton Springs Edwards Aquifer.
